## 17 NOV (Tuesday) SAINT ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY, Patroness of the Third Order (1207-1231)

The daughter of King Andrew of Hungary; she married Prince Louis of Thuringa at age 13. Built a hospital at the foot of the mountain on which her castle stood and tended to the sick herself. Once when she was taking food to the poor and sick, Prince Louis stopped her and looked under her mantle to see what she was carrying; the food had been miraculously changed to roses.



## 21 NOV (Saturday) THE PRESENTATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Commemorating the presentation of the Blessed Virgin as a child in the Temple where, according to tradition, she was educated. The feast originated in the Orient, probably about the 7th century. It was introduced into the Western Church in the 14th century, abolished by Pope Pius V, but reestablished by Sixtus V in 1585.

*(conclusion)*

In particular, I would like to call attention to those family members who are the most vulnerable, the young. For many of them, a future filled with countless possibilities beckons, yet so many others seem disoriented and aimless, trapped in a hopeless maze of violence, abuse and despair. Their problems are our problems. We cannot avoid them. We need to face them together, to talk about them and to seek effective solutions rather than getting bogged down in discussions. At the risk of oversimplifying, we might say that we live in a culture which pressures young people not to start a family, because they lack possibilities for the future. Yet this same culture presents others with so many options that they too are dissuaded from starting a family.

A nation can be considered great when it defends liberty as Lincoln did, when it fosters a culture which enables people to "dream" of full rights for all their brothers and sisters, as Martin Luther King sought to do; when it strives for justice and the cause of the oppressed, as Dorothy Day did by her tireless work, the fruit of a faith which becomes dialogue and sows peace in the contemplative style of Thomas Merton.

In these remarks I have sought to present some of the richness of your cultural heritage, of the spirit of the American people. It is my desire that this spirit continue to develop and grow, so that as many young people as possible can inherit and dwell in a land which has inspired so many people to dream.

# Young Believers

So you think you know your Bible stories?  
Try these five questions:



1. **TRUE** or **FALSE**: Adam and Eve disobeyed God by eating an apple.

**FALSE**: The Bible does not specify that it was an apple, only that it was a “fruit”. [GEN 2:3]

2. **TRUE** or **FALSE**: Noah took only two of each kind of animal into the ark.

**FALSE**: Noah was instructed by God to take “one pair” of all the unclean animals, but “seven pairs” of every clean animal and bird.” [GEN 7:1-3]

3. **TRUE** or **FALSE**: There were three Wise Men.

**FALSE**: The Bible never says how many; it only refers to “magi” and “they”. [MAT 2:1-12]

4. **TRUE** or **FALSE**: The Wise Men visited Jesus in the manger right after He was born.

**FALSE**: The Bible says the Magi arrived “after Jesus was born” and that the star sent them to “the place where the Child was”, referring to it as “the house.” Some scholars believe this might have been up to two years after Jesus’ birth, which would explain why Herod ordered the killing of all male children two years and younger. [MAT 2:9-11]

5. **TRUE** or **FALSE**: On the road to Damascus, when God spoke to Saul (the future St. Paul), the bright flash of light knocked Saul off his horse.

**FALSE**: The Bible never says anything about a horse. It says that Saul “fell to the ground.” [ACTS 9:4]
