30 NOV (Monday) SAINT ANDREW, Apostle

St. Andrew was first a disciple of **John the Baptist**. When he became a follower of Christ, he brought along his brother, **Simon Peter**. Andrew is the apostle who found a boy carrying loaves and fishes, which Jesus multiplied for the hungry multitude. He was crucified at Achaia on an "X"-shaped cross (in heraldry an "X"-shaped charge (*saltire*) is often referred to as a *St. Andrew's cross*). Andrew is said to have preached for two days while on the cross. He is the patron saint of Scotland.



03 DEC (Wednesday) SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER, Priest (1506-1552)

Born in Spain, Francis Xavier studied in Paris and became a follower of **Ignatius Loyola**. He was one of the founding **Jesuits**, and the first Jesuit missionary. He proclaimed the Gospel in India and Japan, and died on Sancian, an island near the China coast. He is the patron saint of foreign travelers.

STOP ASSISTED SUICIDE IN CALIFORNIA

Stop assisted suicide in California before it's too late! The California legislature inappropriately passed assisted suicide during a special session intended to address Medi-Cal funding. This new law would allow doctors to prescribe lethal drugs to enable terminally ill patients to kill themselves. This law would endanger California's poor, elderly, and disabled people. In Europe, these laws have resulted in horrendous abuses, as they have in Oregon, where the suicide rate for non-terminal people increased 49% after assisted suicide became legal. Life is sacred. Our dying sisters and brothers need our care and comfort, not a deadly prescription. A referendum is underway to overturn this bad law. Over 365,000 signatures are needed by early January. Nativity will be collecting signatures in coming weeks. Donations are also needed to help fund professional signature gatherers, as no referendum has succeeded via volunteers only. For the Latin Rite of Roman Catholicism, this Sunday is the beginning of the liturgical year. Western Christian liturgical calendars are based on the cycle of the Roman or Latin Rite (even Protestant calendars, since this cycle pre-dates the Protestant Reformation). The liturgical seasons are Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time (time after Epiphany), Lent, Easter, and Ordinary Time (time after Pentecost).

So we have now completed the "last" season of the Church year, and today marks the beginning of a new liturgical year.



The First Friday and First Saturday Devotions

Many Catholics observe special devotions on the First Friday and First Saturday of each month, particularly attendance at Mass and the reception of the Eucharist.

First Friday:

Our Lord revealed to Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, as one of the 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart:

"In the excess of the mercy of My Heart, I promise you that My all-powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridgus, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in My displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and My Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour."

First Saturday:

Subsequent to the apparitions at Fatima, our Blessed Mother appeared again to Saint Lucia, on 10 DEC 1925, with the Child Jesus by her side. At that time, she revealed her Immaculate Heart to Lucia, and told her: "Look, my daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console Me and say that I promise to assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Me."

Would you consider making this one of your own special devotions to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary?
