# SAINTS AND OBSERVANCES

**19 OCT (Monday):**

## **SAINTS ISAAC JOGUES, JOHN DE BRÉBEUF and COMPANIONS, Martyrs**

Missionaries to the Mohawks and Iroquois, who were brutally tortured and martyred for the faith in New France.

**23 OCT (Friday)**

## **SAINT JOHN OF CAPISTRANO, Priest (1386-1456)**

John was governor of Perugia under King Landislas of Naples. When war broke out between Perugia and Malatesta in 1416, John tried to broker a peace, but instead his opponents ignored the truce, and John became a prisoner of war. During his imprisonment he came to the decision to change vocations, and became a Franciscan. He was reported to heal by making the Sign of the Cross over a sick person. After the fall of Constantinople, he preached a Crusade against the Muslim Turks. At age 70 he was commissioned by Pope Callistus II to lead it, and marched off at the head of 70,000 Christian soldiers. He won the great battle of Belgrade in the summer of 1456, then died in the field a few months later.



**20 OCT (Tuesday)**

## **SAINT PAUL OF THE CROSS, Priest (1694-1775)**

After receiving a vision, and while still a layman, Paul founded the *Congregation of Discalced Clerks of the Most Holy Cross and Passion* (the *Passionists*) in 1721 to preach about Jesus Crucified. Paul was a preacher of such power that hardened soldiers and bandits were seen to weep.



**24 OCT (Saturday)**

## **SAINT ANTHONY MARY CLARET, Priest (1807-1870)**

Anthony is considered the “spiritual father of Cuba”, where he spent many years as the archbishop of Santiago, trying to effect reforms despite fierce (and deadly) opposition (he was once attacked by a paid assassin whose release from prison Anthony had previously obtained). He was ordered back to Spain by the pope to become confessor to Queen Isabella II. He followed her into exile in France after the revolution of 1868. Anthony was a prolific preacher (10,000 sermons), writer, and publisher (over 200 works), and always encouraged deep devotion to the Eucharist and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It was said that his rosary never left his hand.

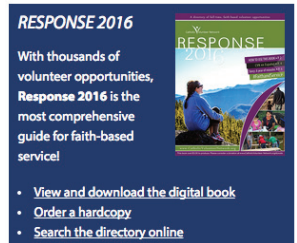

The challenges facing us today call for a renewal of that spirit of cooperation, which has accomplished so much good throughout the history of the United States. The complexity, the gravity and the urgency of these challenges demand that we pool our resources and talents, and resolve to support one another, with respect for our differences and our convictions of conscience.

In this land, the various religious denominations have greatly contributed to building and strengthening society. It is important that today, as in the past, the voice of faith continue to be heard, for it is a voice of fraternity and love, which tries to bring out the best in each person and in each society. Such cooperation is a powerful resource in the battle to eliminate new global forms of slavery, born of grave injustices which can be overcome only through new policies and new forms of social consensus.

Here I think of the political history of the United States, where democracy is deeply rooted in the mind of the American people. All political activity must serve and promote the good of the human person and be based on respect for his or her dignity. "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness" (Declaration of Independence, 4 July 1776). If politics must truly be at the service of the human person, it follows that it cannot be a slave to the economy and finance. Politics is, instead, an expression of our compelling need to live as one, in order to build as one the greatest common good: that of a community which sacrifices particular interests in order to share, in justice and peace, its goods, its interests, its social life. I do not underestimate the difficulty that this involves, but I encourage you in this effort.

Here too I think of the march which Martin Luther King led from Selma to Montgomery fifty years ago as part of the campaign to fulfill his "dream" of full civil and political rights for African Americans. That dream continues to inspire us all. I am happy that America continues to be, for many, a land of "dreams". Dreams

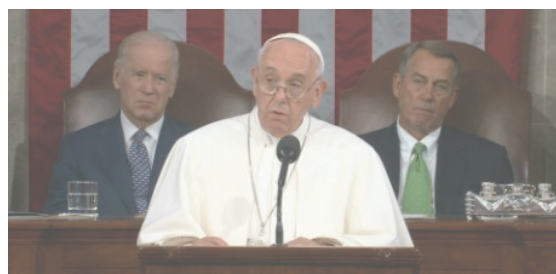

With the ever-increasing use of email and texting, the abbreviation “OMG” has come into widespread and common use (even appearing in advertisements for the California lottery at one time!). While many people may regard this as “simply an expression”, it is in fact a **blasphemy**: you are taking the Lord’s name in vain, in violation of the Second Commandment. Are you willing to be a strong Catholic and obey the Commandments that our Creator gave us? Don’t use this “phrase”, and encourage others to follow your good example (it’s a small sacrifice: offer it up for the souls in Purgatory!).

The Church also offers us a **partial indulgence** if we say “Blessed be God” whenever we hear God’s name taken in vain. So the next time someone texts you “OMG”, text them back “BBG”. And when they ask you what it means, explain this whole situation to them!
