08 NOV (Tuesday)
BLESSED JOHN DUNS SCOTUS (1266-1308)

09 NOV (Wednesday)
DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA
The **Basilica of St. John Lateran** is the cathedral church of Rome and the official ecclesiastical seat of the Pope. Officially named the *Archbasilica of the Most Holy Savior*, it is the oldest and ranks first (being the only cathedral in Rome) among the four major basilicas of Rome, and holds the title of **ecumenical mother church** (mother church of the whole inhabited world) among Roman Catholics.

10 NOV (Thursday)
SAINT LEO THE GREAT, Pope and Doctor of the Church (c. 400-461)

Pope from 440 to 461, during the time of the invasion of Attila the Hun. When Attila marched on Rome, Leo went out to meet him and pleaded for leave. As Leo spoke, Attila saw the vision of a man in priestly robes (believed to be **St. Peter**), carrying a bare sword, and threatening to kill the invader if he did not obey Pope Leo.

11 NOV (Friday)
VETERANS DAY

SAINT MARTIN OF TOURS, Bishop (c. 316-397)
Martin was born to pagan parents; his father was a Roman military officer and tribune. Martin joined the Roman imperial army at age 15. He once gave a beggar half of his heavy officer's cloak, and later had a vision of Jesus wearing the cloak. Martin was persecuted by the Arians, who were openly hostile to Catholics, and later became first a hermit, then the bishop of Tours. Martin was the first non-martyr to receive the cultus of a saint.

LIVES OF THE SAINTS: Saint Martin of Tours

Born: 316 Died: November 8th, 397

Feast Day: November 11th



WHAT THE WORLD WAS LIKE

Saint Martin of Tours lived during the fourth century. During this time, Constantine I ruled the Roman Empire, and he was the first emperor to be baptized a Christian. By the end of the century, Christianity became the official religion of the Empire.

WHO HE WAS

Saint Martin was born in France. His father was a senior officer in the Roman army. Martin had no desire to join the army. He was far more interested in learning about Christianity, which was still not widely accepted. However, because he was the son of an officer, he had to join the army when he was only fifteen years old.

Martin lived as a humble, religious man in the army. Although he was allowed to have a servant, he never asked the servant for anything. While Martin was a soldier, he experienced something that changed his life. One day he saw a beggar who did not have enough clothes to keep himself warm. Martin immediately cut his own cloak in half and gave the other half to the beggar. In his sleep that night, Martin had a dream in which Jesus was wearing the piece of cloak. Soon after having this dream, he was baptized.

When Martin was twenty years old, he decided that he could no longer fight in the army. When he was released from the army's service, he went to the city of Tours. There, he became a follower of Hilary of Poitiers. Hilary and Martin together set up a monastery just outside of Tours. Martin lived a quiet life in the monastery and was always willing to welcome those who were less fortunate.

When the Bishop of Tours died in 371, the people of Tours agreed that they wanted Martin to become the new bishop. Martin wanted a life of solitude and prayer, and so at first he refused to become the bishop. However, some residents of Tours tricked him into coming to the city. Although he resisted, he eventually became the new Bishop of Tours. Martin did not change the way he lived when he became a bishop. He continued living a simple life. He prayed, taught, and preached throughout France. He served as Bishop of Tours for over twenty years until his death at the age of eighty-one.

WHAT HE MEANS TO US

Saint Martin lived a life of great humility and modesty. He was a great man whose example we should all strive to follow. He helped people out of the kindness of his heart, not for glory or fame.

PRAYER FOR VETERANS

Almighty God, we commend to Your gracious care and keeping all the men and women of our Armed Forces at home and abroad. Defend them day by day with Your heavenly grace; strengthen them in their trials and temptations; give them courage to face the perils which beset them; and grant them a sense of Your abiding presence wherever they may be; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
