05 SEP (Monday):

LABOR DAY

On **05 September 1882**, the first **Labor Day** parade was held in New York City. Twenty thousand workers marched in a parade up Broadway. They carried banners that read *LABOR CREATES ALL WEALTH* and *EIGHT HOURS FOR WORK, EIGHT HOURS FOR REST, EIGHT HOURS FOR RECREATION!* After the parade there were picnics all around the city. At night, fireworks were set off. Within the next few years, the idea spread from coast to coast, and all states celebrated **Labor Day**. In **1894**, Congress voted it a federal holiday.

09 SEP (Friday): SAINT PETER CLAVER, Priest (1581-1654)

A Jesuit missionary to America, Peter ministered physically and spiritually to the slaves when they arrived in Cartegena. He reportedly converted 300,000, and worked for humane treatment on the plantations for 40 years. He organized charitable societies among the Spanish in America similar to those in Europe by St. Vincent de Paul.
