SAINT BERNARD OF CORLEONE, Religious
(1605-1667)

A shoemaker by trade, Bernard was also considered the greatest swordsman and duelist in Sicily in his day. After mortally wounding a man named Canino in a duel, he sought sanctuary from the law in the church of the Capuchin Friars Minor in Palermo. While hiding there, he had a true conversion, and became a lay-brother of the Order in 1632, changing his name to Brother Bernardo.



He was noted for his extreme austerity and self-imposed penances in an attempt to atone for his earlier life. He had the gift of healing animals by prayer.

POPE'S "URBI ET ORBI" MESSAGE FOR 2016

Central Loggia of the Vatican Basilica ~ Sunday, 25 DEC 2016

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Happy Christmas!

Today the Church once more experiences the wonder of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Saint Joseph and the shepherds of Bethlehem, as they contemplate the newborn Child laid in a manger: Jesus, the Saviour.

On this day full of light, the prophetic proclamation resounds:

"For to us a child is born, To us a son is given. And the government will be upon his shoulder; and his name will be called "Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Is 9:6)

The power of this Child, Son of God and Son of Mary, is not the power of this world, based on might and wealth; it is the power of love. It is the power that created the heavens and the earth, and gives life to all creation: to minerals, plants and animals. It is the force that attracts man and woman, and makes them one flesh, one single existence. It is the power that gives new birth, forgives sin, reconciles enemies, and transforms evil into good. It is the power of God. This power of love led Jesus Christ to strip himself of his glory and become man; it led him to give his life on the cross and to rise from the dead. It is the power of service, which inaugurates in our world the Kingdom of God, a kingdom of justice and peace. For this reason, the birth of Jesus was accompanied by the angels' song as they proclaimed:

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!" (Lk 2:14).

Today this message goes out to the ends of the earth to reach all peoples, especially those scarred by war and harsh conflicts that seem stronger than the yearning for peace.

SOME NOTES ABOUT EPIPHANY

In the earliest days of the Church, both the **Nativity** and the **Theophany** (baptism of Jesus) were celebrated on **06 JAN**. Somewhere before 354 AD the Western Church moved the date for the celebration of the **Nativity** back to **25 DEC**, partly to overshadow a pagan festival (to the Invincible Sun) on that same date. At that time they assigned **06 JAN** to the celebration of the **Epiphany** (visit of the Magi). The Eastern Church today celebrates the **Theophany** on **06 JAN**. The Russian Church still celebrates the **Nativity** on **06 JAN**, and in some traditions, a “Twelfth Night” celebration on **05 JAN** is followed by the traditional exchange of gifts on **06 JAN**.

BLESSING OF THE HOME: “CHALKING THE LINTEL”

Since the Middle Ages there has been a tradition in many Christian households that on (or near) the **Feast of the Epiphany** we pray for God’s blessing on our homes, marking the doorpost (lintel) with chalk (an incarnational image reminding us of the dust of the earth from which we were made). We mark the main door of our home with the initials of the Magi and the numerals of the new year, connected with crosses:

20 + C + M + B + 17

The initials remind us of the legendary names of the Magi - **Caspar**, **Melchior**, and **Balthasar** - and also stand for the Latin motto: **Christus mansionem benedicat** (*May Christ bless this house*) In the Book of Exodus, the Israelites marked their doors with blood so that the Lord would pass over their homes; but in this ritual, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign that we have invited God’s presence and blessing into our homes.
