

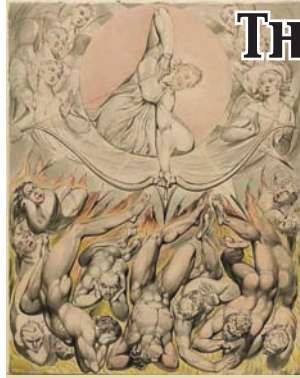

## 01 AUG (Tuesday): SAINT ALPHONSUS MARIA DE LIGUORI, Bishop and Doctor of the Church (1696-1787)

Neapolitan lawyer (at the age of 16) who became a priest and founder of a new religious order, the **Redemptorists**, devoted to missionary work. He is noted for his opposition to Jansenism, and for his profuse writings, particularly his devotional works.



## 04 AUG (Friday): SAINT JOHN MARY VIANNEY, Priest (1786-1859)

Ordained after many difficulties, **John** pastored a parish in the town of Ars, France, and became renowned for his counsel, often spending 11-16 hours in the confessional.

### NATIVITY SCHOOL OF RELIGION: 2017-2018

Registration has begun for Nativity's **Children's Faith Formation Program**. Children who attend public or independent schools in 1st through 8th grades should be enrolled in Nativity's School of Religion for ongoing faith formation.

Registration forms and information packets are available online ([www.nativitymenlo.org](http://www.nativitymenlo.org)) under the *School of Religion* link. We encourage all children to continue on in the School of Religion after receiving First Communion, through all grade levels until the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Mrs. Hickam will be available after Masses on **12-13, 20 and 26-27 AUG 2017** and **09-10 SEP 2017** to register your children and answer any questions about the program. **Sacrament Class** and **Classes for grades 1-6** are held on **Sundays** from **08:15-09:15 AM** at Nativity School and continue on into our **09:30 AM** Mass with our *Children's Liturgy of the Word* (beginning **24 SEP 2017**) Confirmation Preparation Classes are held on **Wednesday** evenings from **07:00-08:00 PM** in the O'Hare Center beginning **11 OCT 2017**.

**First Reconciliation/First Holy Communion** requires 2 years of instruction before a child is eligible to receive these Sacraments. Children should be enrolled in 1st grade.

**Confirmation Preparation** is also a 2-year program as required by the Archdiocese of San Francisco. Children should be enrolled as they enter 7th grade, but will include older students who have not yet been confirmed.

A kick-off celebration will be held on **17 SEP 2017** (Catechetical Sunday), after the **09:30AM** Mass. Classes begin on **Sunday, 24 SEP 2017** and the Confirmation Classes begin on **11 OCT 2017**.

# Young Believers

**Questions From the Annals of Catechism Classes:**  
 “Please explain the significance of the different colors of robes priests wear when celebrating Mass.”

The **General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM)** provides the norms for liturgical colors. What follows is a list of the colors and when each is used, and then an explanation of what the colors signify. The colors and seasons are given in **GIRM, no. 346**:

Traditional usage should be retained for the vestment colors.

a) **White** is used in the offices and masses during the seasons of Easter and Christmas; also on celebrations of the Lord, other than of His passion; on celebrations of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the angels, saints who were not martyrs; on the solemnity of All Saints (November 1); the feasts of the Birth of John the Baptist (June 24), John, apostle, evangelist (December 27), the Chair of Peter (February 22), and the Conversion of Paul (January 25).

b) **Red** is used on Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) and Good Friday, Pentecost Sunday, celebrations of the Lord’s passion, “birthday” feasts of the apostles and evangelists, and celebrations of martyrs.

c) **Green** is used in the offices and Masses of Ordinary Time.

d) **Violet** is used in Advent and Lent. It may also be worn in Offices and Masses for the dead.

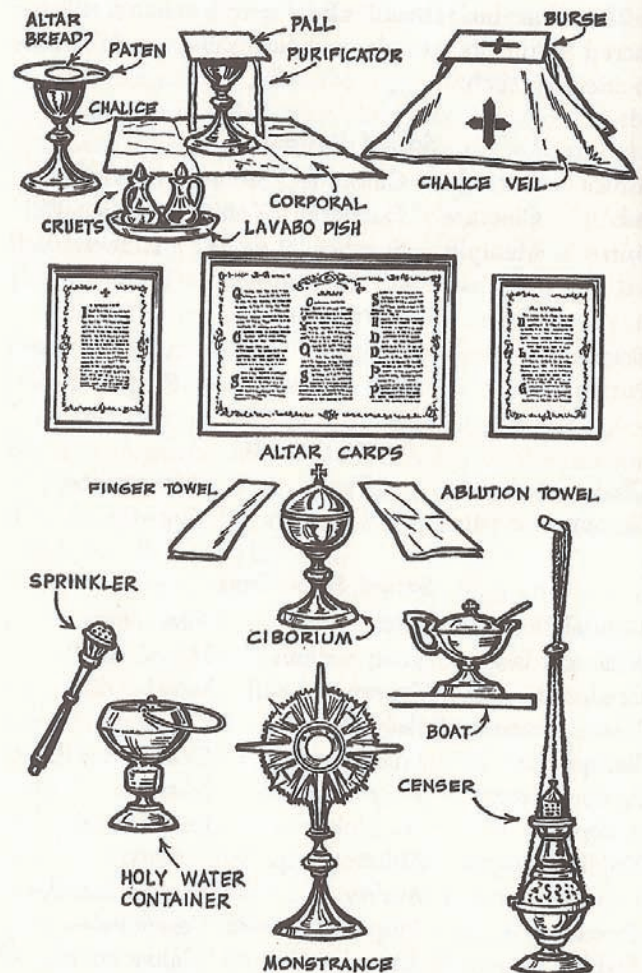
e) **Black** may be used, where it is the custom, in Masses for the dead.

f) **Rose** may be used, where it is the custom, on Gaudete Sunday (Third Sunday of Advent) and Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent).

**GIRM, no. 345** says that the various colors of liturgical vestments are “meant to give effective, outward expression to the specific character of the mysteries of faith being celebrated and, in the course of the liturgical year, to a sense of progress in the Christian life.”
